Position Overview:

Under the direction of the President, the Director of Development oversees the OGSA's global development strategy; responsible for coordinating development programs for Coaches, Junior Umpires and Athletes, helping implement Long Term Player Development (LTPD) principles and Best Practices, while acting as liaison between the OGSA divisions.

Key Responsibilities:

- Develop in-depth comprehension of Softball Canada's Long Term Player Development (LTPD)
 and working knowledge of LTPD Best Practices
- Enlist knowledge of LTPD to make recommendations and assist with the planning and advancement of internal Development initiatives
- Conduct annual review of Development initiatives and performance within the OGSA divisions
- Make recommendations for improved program performance based on LTPD Best Practices
- Advise President and OGSA Board on contemporary LTPD advancements
- Oversee the implementation of LTPD Clinics, Workshops and Training such as Advanced Training (ATP), Player Development Clinics, Group Practices, Junior Umpires, Coaches-NCCP and Colour Your Dream-PWSA

Qualifications & Skills:

- Leadership experience including supervision (1-10 employees)
- Self-managed: Organized and able to work with minimal supervision
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Past experience as a Coach, Trainer and/or Player is considered an asset
